    Note (ii): Includes ₹ 541.21 Crores ( 31.12 .2016 - ₹ 541.21 Crores; 30.09 .2017 - ₹ 541.21 Crores; 31.03.2017 - ₹ 541.21 Crores) towards payment to IFCI Limited and applicable stamp duty for purchase of a five star hotel resort in Goa operating under the name Park Hyatt Goa Resort \& Spa and IFCI Limited issued required sale certificate in favour of the Company. The erstwhile owners of the property thereafter challenged the sale. By its judgement dated 23.03.2016, the Bombay High Court set aside the sale and directed IFCI Limited to refund the sale consideration to the Company. The Company and IFCI Limited have approached the Hon'ble Supreme Court against the High Court judgement. The Hon'ble Supreme Court by its order dated 22.04 .2016 has directed maintenance of status quo and that the amount paid by ITC shall remain with IFCI Limited until further orders. The hearing of the matter is completed and is awaiting judgement by the Hon'ble Supreme Court.
